## Chapter 8 Roadcraft

### ***Introduction –***

The marshalling of all types of open air events often necessitates the implementation of temporary traffic management measures.

It is important to plan and carry this out safely, to minimise congestion, delay and inconvenience.

Health and Safety legislation requires event management and those employed to carry out traffic management duties on roads to establish and maintain safe working practices.

Chapter 8 of the Traffic Signs Manual 2009, provides guidance on how to plan temporary traffic management to create a safe working environment for workers and to reduce risks to drivers and to vulnerable road users such as pedestrians and cyclists. This is supported by the New Roads and Street Works Act 1991.

### ***This Course Aim –***

- To equip delegates with the sufficient information and knowledge to safely direct traffic movements at Events.
